Topic 2



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Presentation Format


- The cover of the presentation should <u>include the school</u> <u>emblem</u>, the title of the report, the name of the presenter, and the name of the school.
- ➤ The national flag of the country should be placed in the upper left corner of the cover.

 An example is shown in the figure on right
- The presentation should <u>mainly use English</u>, and it is recommended to have a <u>total of 12 pages</u> (including the cover and ending pages).
- Each group is limited to 2-3 students, and each school can only have 1 group, with a total of 6 groups.
- ➤ The presentation time for <u>each group is 10 minutes</u>.


