- **In Laos**, it's rude to drink anything with your meal, while in the U.S. it's customary to do so.
- **In Japan**, it's polite to slurp your noodles with gusto, while in the U.S. it's considered rude.

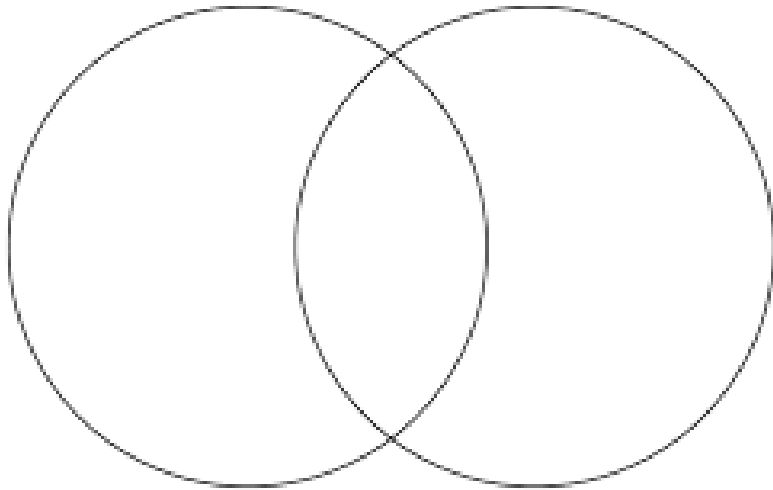




Table manners

Table manners

- Lean over your plate

- Say excuse when you burp
