August 4th, 1944

The people in hiding were discovered. February, 1945

Anne and Margot died exhausted in the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp.

30 April 1945

Hitler committed suicide. Otto Frank was the only occupant of the Secret Annex to survive.

1947

Otto fulfilled his daughter's wish by publishing the diary.

Anne Frank's Diary of a Young Girl: Background

- On June 12th, 1942, the Jewish girl Ann Frank received a diary as her thirteen-year-old birthday gift.
- In July of the same year, her sister Margot got a summons from the Schutzstaffel.

Thereby, the Frank family was forced to hide and take shelter in sealed-off attic rooms in Otto's company building in Amsterdam.

From then on, until they were unfortunately arrested, Ann Frank, who had made up her mind to be a writer, kept writing in her diary despite all the hardships. The reason why Otto Frank published his daughter's diary

Anne had always wanted to be a writer.

Otto's excerpts were read not just by his relatives, but by friends as well. They felt that Anne's texts were "an important human document" and that Otto should not keep the texts to himself. The reason why Otto Frank published his daughter's diary

Otto Frank omitted some things, such as a piece in which Anne wrote harshly about his marriage to Edith.

Afterwards

On August 4, 1944, a German secret police officer and four Dutch Nazis stormed into the Secret Annex, arresting everyone. They had been betrayed by an anonymous tip.

On September 3, they were transferred to the Auschwitz concentration camp.

Afterwards

- After several months of hard labor, they were again transferred. Anne and Margot arrived at the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp.
- Anne and Margot both came down with typhus. They died within a day of each other in March 1945, only a few weeks before British soldiers liberated the concentration camp.
