TEACHERS

- Our teachers at Mira Model School, quickly adapted to the situation brought upon by the lockdown due to Covid-19 and started classes online for the entire school so that student learning could continue.
- Indeed, the driving force of a school is its teachers who themselves are highly motivated to learn and scale new heights. Our teachers have engaged in a lot of professional learning and competitive events, constantly learning to teach better.
- In the “XSEED Super Teacher Contest” organised by XSEED Education, Ms. Varleen Kaur was adjudged the third runner up from India and was awarded a medal, certificate and citation. As a part of the award she also attended a “Leadership Development Program” at IIM Lucknow in November 2019. Ms. Diksha Grover was selected for the second round in the same event.
- Ms. Neelam Kadiyan represented the Indian Masters Volleyball team in European Masters Games held at Turin Italy, winning the team Gold Medal.
- Ms. Gurmeet Kaur received a four-week scholarship in June last year to pursue a German language course B2.3 level from the Goethe Institute Berlin, Germany.
- In the Connecting Classroom series module on Collaborative Learning, staff members shared their best practices in the Reflections event, organized by the British Council on the 6th of September last year. Ms. Shalu Palta was awarded the title, “Performer of the Day”
- Ms. Shelly Manchanda got a commendation on her essay “Being a 21st Century Educator” in the annual NPSC Essay Writing Competition, in February this year.
- A workshop on “Academic Supervision and Leadership and Flipped and Blended Learning” was organised by our school in Collaboration with the NPSC and ETMA headed by Professor MarmarMukhopadhyaya, on the 19th and 20th September last year by 15 teachers from our school and 37 teachers from schools across Delhi NCR.
- A capacity building program was organised by the CBSE for Class 10 Science teachers from Delhi NCR, at our school on the 21st and 22nd December last year and attended by Ms. Seema Kapoor and Ms. Anjali Sharma.
- On 8th February this year, seven of our school teachers, attended an educational summit on “Reimagining Education” organized by Teach for India at the American Embassy.

- A capacity building workshop in collaboration with CBSE for Teaching of English for Class 10 was held at our school on the 11th and 12th of December last year.
- Ms. IshwinderGiri was nominated for the Best Teacher Award Category, for a project on Spoken English, carried out by British Council Macmillan Education under the Directorate of Education Delhi; during May and June last year.
- Ms PreetiChhabra attended the 9th National Conference of Mathematics Technology and Innovation in Maths Education held at the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research Pune, from 26th December to 29th December last year.
- Ms. Puneeti Khanna attended a workshop on preserving and conserving India's vast Natural and Cultural Heritage by sensitizing students in April last year.

STUDENTS:

Many of our students from class 12 have been placed in reputed colleges and universities.

We know that all classes have their star students who have achieved excellent results and we will be recognising and awarding them at another event.

Our School provides a platform to our students to participate in a large number of International and National competitions, allowing students and teachers to assess their learning in a more competitive environment at International, national and state levels.

- **USA TRIP :** With stars in their eyes and a spring in their steps, 17 students from class 6th to 12th, along with staff members Mrs. Sunita Kumar and Mrs. PratibhaSaxena, embarked upon a trip to the United States from May 23rd to June 3rd last year. Our students had the lifetime opportunity of visiting the Kennedy Space Centre, and meeting astronauts. The trip also took them to Disney Land, The Statue of Liberty, Times Square New York and the Niagara Falls.
- Our School has participated for the International School Award, which seeks to provide opportunities to develop a pedagogic framework to indicate 21st century life skills among our students. As part of the ISA Action Plan, our school conducted many co curricular and curricular subjects for varied age groups to promote UN goals for sustainable development.
- Our School secured the Second Position in the Da Vinci Decathlon 2019, initiated by the Knox Grammar School, Australia, on the 30th September and 1st October last year. Our Team comprising of teachers and students competed as online participants under the theme "Voice".
- In the Australian National Chemistry Quiz organised by the Royal Chemistry Institute, with participants from over 20 countries, our school was awarded,

 - And 12 Credits

- Many of our students performed splendidly in various Olympiads and competitions held in different subjects last year.
- Vedant of class 2D emerged as a Star Performer in Mathematics, English and Science olympiads.

- In the Regional Science Fair our School presented the model “Agri Jal Sanrakshan” on 22nd and 23rd November 2019, at Bal Bharti Rohini
- Our School participated in the 15th Dr. A. K. Saha Memorial Young Scientist’s Experimental Science Investigatory Project held at Springdales Dhaula Kuan on 9th August 2019. The project called “G-Force” aimed to provide security where human surveillance was not possible, received appreciation and verbal mention from the judges.
- At the IILM Young Citizens Award held at IILM University on the 24th of October, 2019 our school team consisting of Vani Negi and Mahika of class 12, Ansh Kapila, Lakshay Jalewal, Harprabh Singh, Prerak Varshney, Vedant, Sidharth Banga of class 11 and Manasvi Raj and Sajal Batra of class 10 reached the top 10 in the final round at the National level.
- In a two day workshop on the 4th and 5th of February this year, held by the British Council in collaboration with Microsoft, our students led by Mr. Raj Kumar Pal, learnt the use of Microbit for resolving problems related to UN Sustainable Development goals, and submitted a project for Global competition titled “A BBC Microbit challenge for children and teens to combine creativity and technology for the Global goals”
- An ATL Community Day was celebrated on 19th April 2019 to commemorate the birth of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and provide equal opportunity to all. We welcomed 80 Students from GD Goenka School, Model Town, New Delhi and 24 students from Saraswati Bal Mandir School, Rajouri Garden, New Delhi to celebrate a fun filled day to tinker and innovate.

SUPPORT CENTRE

Student Support Centre has been in action since 2008. Purpose of this group of professionals is to assist the school towards inclusion of all children into the main stream educational process. Students, teachers and parents are all welcome to seek interventions and consultations.

This centre fulfils the needs of all students through following programs:

1. Early Intervention Programme

This programme is rendered to students identified by classroom teachers as falling behind their peers in academic achievement. In order to prevent further stagnation and unnecessary identification with disability, this programme focuses on developing phonological awareness, reading fluency mechanics and expression in writing and second language skills.

In the session 2017-2018, there were around 20 students referred by class teachers, who were falling behind their peers in academic achievement. These students were screened in readiness skills for grade eleven students out of twenty, scored less than 50% in the readiness skills and were taken for Early Intervention Programme.

Out of 11, 9 students were able to attain goals of early intervention programme and two were struggling both in Early Intervention and class room performance respectively. Six students were those who were doing well in early intervention but their classroom performance was lagging behind. In short, out of 11, 5 could reach at par with their peers.

2. Special Education Programme

This Programme fulfils the needs of differently abled students who have already been identified with different disabling conditions. In Special Education Programme students deficit areas are assessed and Individual Educational Programme is planned and executed.

In the session 2017-2018, 12 students from classes 3 to 8, who were struggling in academics and were identified with various disabilities, were provided with Special Education. In the intervention programme, skills of attention building, perceptual skills, memory, reading & writing skills etc were worked upon. Some classroom curriculum intervention was also carried out for students attending Special Education of primary grade. Out of 12, 11 were promoted to next class. One student got compartment, which she cleared and was promoted to the next class.

Three students had attained the set targets and Special Education is terminated for them. One of the student has discontinued before attaining the set targets. Eight students are still continuing Special Education Programme.

3. Counseling Services

It provides counseling to students around social, emotional, behavioral and academic concerns. In the session 2017-2018, counseling service was rendered to 224 students approx {104 students for classes 1-5 & 120 for classes 7-12} respectively. Referrals for counseling ranged from academic (inattention, incomplete work, non submission of copies, poor academic performance, low motivation to study etc) to behavioral-social-emotional concerns like disobedience, bunking, hitting/fighting, disturbing others in class, talking, sexual comments, school refusal, OCD, Inability to make friends and sustain relationships etc.

Various Interventions were under taken for above mentioned concerns like building peer support, small group work exercises, coordination with teachers, parent guidance etc. Approximately, between 50-60 students, who had come for need based work, sessions are closed for them. There are other students who with constant support and monitoring, are better able to adjust, work and progress in the school environment.

4. Accommodations

In order to provide adequate chance to all students with special educational needs, the SSC ensures provision of reading out, help in spellings, provision of scribe/writer as and when indicated. In the session 2017-2018,26 students were benefitted from various accommodations.

5. Consultation to parents

SSC provides guidance and psycho education to parents and teachers in relation to the student's academic, behavioral and social-emotional well being. PTMS' were done with around 200 parents (approx) and parent training and guidance programmes were held.

6. Reference & Liason with community professionals

In order to meet intensive intervention needs of students, the SSC professionals facilitate intervention plans in collaboration with parents and community professionals. Students not performing well in academics or behavior etc, are screened or referred to outside agencies for availing accommodations/exemptions etc in school.

7. Building Lifelong support system

Students are best enabled when their environment is empowered to make this a reality. Parents and peers are continually trained and engaged as scribes and peer mentors respectively.

8. Workshops

- Sessions were conducted on managing negative emotions for all sections of class 9.
- Sessions were also conducted for classes 6-7 on antibullying.
- Organized workshop for class tenth on study skills, conducted by Fortis.
- They organized many workshops on Gender Sensitivity, Mother Daughter program on "Menstruation and hygiene", Bullying, POCSO, Caring for the Environment among others.
